

NEED ANALYSIS

- The 23% of the population residing in IDPs hosting sites are among the most vulnerable population who do not have the means to provide adequate shelter solutions for their families and suffer from limited to no assistance so far. They lack structure for the IDP hosting Site Management and Coordination with no one to advocate for their needs.
- The IDPs hosting sites (CCCM) baseline assessment is an essential exercise to drive the response in these sites. So far 776 sites have been assessed in 16 Governorates and the last 4 Governorates are being assessed.

RESPONSE

- The Shelter/NFI/CCCM Cluster identified Partners to support Site Management and Coordination in 44 priority IDP hosting sites agreed in the HRP 2018 as a pilot for the integrated response methodology.
- On the 20th of March, the Cluster facilitated a training on Site Coordination and Management to build the capacity of 21 participants from NGO Partners in the pilot sites to work with IDPs to improve their living conditions, monitor the site and facilitate the effective provision of assistance while advocating for durable solutions when feasible.
- The integrated response methodology was developed and agreed upon between the Main Clusters (Health, Food, Protection, Nutrition etc) to support the implementation of the 'integrated response' pilot project and facilitate coordination and collaboration between Clusters at the National, Sub-National and Site levels.
- A technical working group has been established to support the response in IDPs hosting site through providing the necessary technical support and guidance.
- The Shelter/NFI/CCCM Cluster is working with two of its National Partners to conduct the IDP hosting sites baseline assessment in Hajjah, Al Hudaydah, Sana'a and Al Mahawit Governorates to enable better planning of the response. A training session was delivered on 28th February for 2 days for the assessment teams on the data collection methodology and the assessment tool.

GAPS / CHALLENGES

- Lack of financial resources to coordinate the IDPs hosting sites (CCCM) response.
- Increased eviction threats against the IDPs hosting sites residents in several locations particularly in Amran Governorate.
- Some of the IDPs hosting sites are located in insecure areas, and are exposed to serious protection risks with limited Humanitarian access.
