
Yemen | Assisted Spontaneous Return (ASR)

Highlights (8 – 12 July 2018)

- 54 refugee approached the Return Help Desks (RHD) in Basateen and Kharaz camp for counselling and return-related information. 65 individuals signed VRFs in Basateen and Kharaz camp.
- The 16th ASR movement has been further postponed due to unfavorable weather conditions. IOM is now exploring Air Djibouti as an alternative mode of transportation to Somalia, after being given the go ahead from their HQ.

Challenges

- ASR applicants staying at the Transit Shelter in Basateen have complained about the heat due to high outside temperatures and large number of people staying at the site. Lack of space and overcrowding may provide a breeding ground for diseases, such as cholera.
- The number of ASR applicants arriving to Aden from other Governorates, notably from Sana'a, has increased. At the time of reporting, 33 individuals from other Governorates were staying at the Transit Shelter, out of whom 11 are scheduled to depart on the next boat.
