2 Strengthen preparedness, surveillance and response to communicable diseases outbreaks and epidemics, including immunization for vaccine preventable diseases.


3 Improve access to reproductive, maternal, newborn, child and adolescent health services for vulnerable populations, including IDPs and the poorest and deprived segments in the society

4 Deliver a principled and coordinated health response and promote an integrated approach with other sectors for a comprehensive response focused on the most vulnerable districts.


Cluster Overview

3.1 million people have been reached with health assistance out of 12.3 million people targeted. Ten million people live in 100 districts prioritized for cholera response. The provision of health assistance continues to be challenged by the fact that only 50 per cent of health facilities are fully functional and the non-payments of salaries to health staff.
