
3 Strengthen capacity of national authorities and partners to ensure effective decentralised nutrition response

4 Ensure a predictable timely and effective nutrition response through strengthening robust evidence based system and nutrition needs analysis and advocacy, monitoring and coordination


Cluster Overview

Out of an estimated 5.6 million people in need of nutrition assistance, some 1.2 million people were reached with assistance. Treatment for moderate and acute malnutrition was provided to 342,000 people out of a caseload of 2.9 million people targeted.


Number of beneficiaries (Jan - May 2018)


