**2** Ensure access to basic services for the most vulnerable women and men living in collective centres and spontaneous settlements.

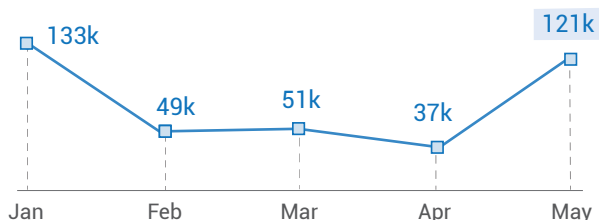
**3** Strengthen accountability to affected people by seeking feedback and addressing concerns

**4** Strengthen capacity of authorities, communities and partners in Shelter, NFI & CCCM programmes

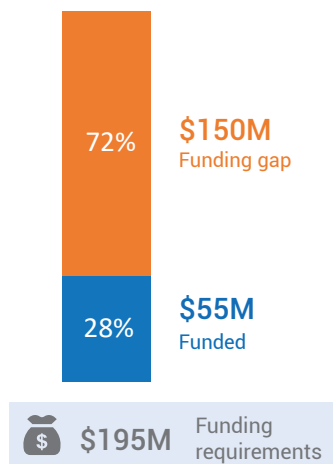
## Cluster Overview

An estimated 3 million people in Yemen need shelter assistance. 90 per cent of the IDPs have been displaced for more than two years. 77 per cent of the IDPs are living with relatives or are renting houses while the remaining caseload live in collective centers or spontaneous settlements.
