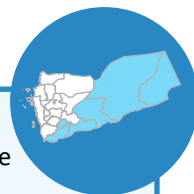
Al Hudaydah Hub

Dozens of people have been killed in Al-Hudaydah governorate due to the increased airstrikes and armed clashes. Thousands of people continue to flee the fighting from and within governorate seeking for safety. The current insecurity in Al Hudaydah affected Cluster Partners operations and the overall access to affected population. Distribution of NFIs (Non-Food Items) started by UNHCR for 2,973 families and EESKs (Enhanced Emergency Shelter Kits) to 1,853 families in As Sukhnah district. DRC started the distribution of EESKs to 199 families in Abs district. The kits allowed families to have access to the critical lifesaving items once they arrive in their displacement locations.



Aden Hub

Civil unrest was witnessed this week in some areas in Aden governorate due to the significant deterioration of local currency and drastically commodities price hikes. The head of CSSW (The Charitable Society for Social Welfare) office in Aden was reported to be assassinated. The Shelter/NFI/CCCM Cluster condemned such acts and called for the protection of humanitarian relief personnel. SNCC (Sub-National Cluster Coordinator) organized a meeting to discuss the situation in the IDP hosting sites of Aden and Lahj governorates. Transfer of the cash grants for rental subsidies completed by UNHCR for 52 IDP families in Aden and Lahj governorates during the week, which enabled the families to continue living in their preferred shelter options and prevented any eviction threats towards them.



Sanaa Hub

During the reporting period, most of the schools that were hosting IDP families in Amanat Al Asimah and Dhamar were vacated and 376 families were assisted with cash grants for rental subsidies while seven families will be assisted once they find houses to rent. It was reported that 96 families have fled the conflict in Al Hudaydah governorate and settled in Amran governorate. UNHCR through YRCS (Yemen Red Crescent Society) assisted 43 families with NFIs and 436 families with cash grants for rental subsidies. ADRA started the distribution of NFIs for 720 families and family tents for 301 families in Dhamar governorate with stocks donated by DFID. These interventions will provide the essential household items and shelter assistance to families who have been recently displaced to alleviate their displacement related suffering and reduce their vulnerability.
