

Yemen: A Severe Food Security Crisis

IPC acute food insecurity phase
mapped by district,
Dec '18 – Jan '19



An estimated 53% of the population in Yemen is facing severe acute food insecurity (IPC Phase 3 or higher), even with ongoing humanitarian assistance. Without assistance the situation is projected to deteriorate further with 67% of Yemenis in IPC Phase 3 or higher.

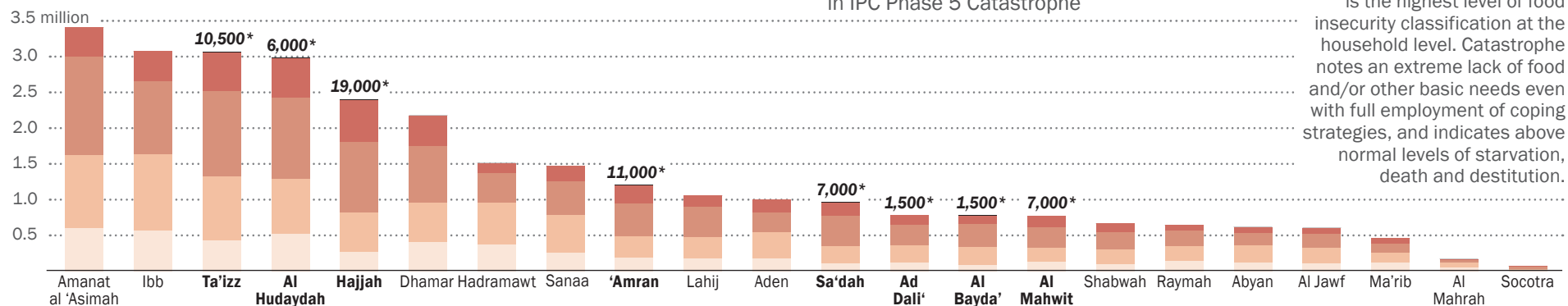
IPC acute food insecurity situation with humanitarian assistance

NOTE: IPC 5 Catastrophe is the highest level of food insecurity classification at the household level. Catastrophe notes an extreme lack of food and/or other basic needs even with full employment of coping strategies, and indicates above normal levels of starvation, death and destitution.
