


YEMEN IDA Emergency and Crisis Response

IDA Engagement in Yemen's Active Conflict. The Bank's current engagement in Yemen provides critical support

to Yemeni families and communities across the country. It helps the people cope with the impact of the crisis through income support, large-scale cash assistance, health and nutrition interventions, cholera response, and restoration of agriculture production. Emergency grants to Yemen are financed by IDA. Since July 2016, IDA grants have reached US\$1.36bn financing emergency operations for the benefit of the Yemeni people. IDA is scaling up funding for Yemen by another \$400 million (for Board approval) to finance the Emergency and Crisis Response and Emergency Health and Nutrition projects. By end of the current fiscal year, IDA's commitments for the benefit of the Yemeni people will amount to \$1.76 billion. A new Country Engagement Note (FY2020-2021) is also underway that aims at maintaining IDA's commitment to basic service delivery for vulnerable populations and support for livelihoods, food security, and basic economic recovery.

Current IDA Emergency Portfolio Through the UN Comprises 5 Active Operations Totaling \$1.36 Billion. Total Disbursement has reached \$1.06 Billion (73.03%).

Leveraging Partnership for Implementation in Conflict. The Bank has forged an extraordinary operational partnership with key UN agencies and local service delivery institutions for the implementation of our program. By leveraging these local and international partnerships, we aim to preserve the implementation capacity of Yemeni institutions now and for the country's future and sustain their ability to deliver basic services that millions of Yemenis rely on.

IDA Operations Portfolio

- **1** Emergency and Crisis Response Project IDA. This includes: i) Labor Intensive Works and Economic Livelihood in partnership with UNDP and ii) Emergency Cash Transfers (incl. \$140mn-AF3) in partnership with UNICEF.
- 2 Emergency Health and Nutrition in partnership with UNICEF and WHO—IDA (incl. Cholera Response).
- 3 Smallholder Agricultural Production Restoration and Enhancement GAFSP in partnership with FAO.
- 4 Integrated Urban Service Delivery IDA in partnership with UNOPS.
- 5 Emergency Electricity Access Project IDA in partnership with UNOPS.

Key Development Results and Impact

Economic Livelihood, Cash Assistance and Response to Food Crisis:

- 1.45mn households (9mn individuals) have received three quarters of cast transfers nationwide with the fourth payment cycle under implementation;
- Over 300,000 direct beneficiaries of wage employment (28% Female; % IDPs);
- 2.5mn people received access to community services (water, roads, irrigation, etc.);
- 6.8mn work days have been created;
- Over 290,000 mothers and children received nutrition services;
- 9 microfinance institutions supported and over 3,000 micro enterprises revived:

Emergency Health, Nutrition and Cholera Response:

- 2,900 health facilities received operating cost support, basic health kits, and/or equipment and furniture;
- Nearly 8,000 health personnel have been trained;
- 3.9 million women and children have received nutrition services;
- Close to 800,000 individuals were successfully treated from cholera which brought the case fatality rate down from 2.3 to 0.2 percent:
- 6.54 million children immunized.

Agriculture, Food Production and Income Generation:

- 44,950 farmers provided with staple seed start-up packages;
- 4.400 farmers provided backyard poultry packages and small ruminants for restocking;
- 6,600 households benefited from rehabilitation of community water infrastructure, and 9,230 beneficiaries for cash for work scheme;
- 4.9 million livestock (belonging to 200,000 households) received vaccinations;

Integrated Urban Services:

- First 180 KW solar rooftop generator installed in a hospital and oncology center in Sana'a visited by 4,000 patients daily;
- 23,181 cubic meters of solid waste collected;
- 52 urban services subprojects currently under implementation, with a pipeline of 237 subprojects totaling US\$55 million in place;

Emergency Electricity Access:

- Project became effective on May 14, 2018 and is in preparation phase. Implementation will begin at end of first quarter of 2019.
- The project aims to restore electricity supply to 200,000 households (1,340,000 people), 400 health facilities and 800 schools.
- The project also aims to strengthen the private-sector supply chain for solar and engage the expansion of local microfinance institutions into solar lending.
